The key causes of action alleged are: Unauthorized Practice Assisting in the Unauthorized Practice of Law, Fraud, and Financial Elder Abuse.

"We the People has found a very lucrative niche in the California market convincing ser will be provided and receive legal documents and services at a fraction of the price a lic attorney would charge. Because the charges for the documents are below the amount r get a Plaintiff into Superior Court, elders have until now been unable to find financial ab attorneys that would take up their cause. The Class Action is a tool to allow seniors to c show the damages they suffered and for the courts to fashion a remedy that will protect from being damaged in the future." Said Kathryn Stebner, one of the attorneys represer Plaintiffs.

How Are Seniors Harmed?

"Trust, wills and legal documents leave no room for error. After a senior has died, defector other legal instruments create a nightmare for the would–be heirs and beneficiaries. improperly, an elder sestate may end up having to be unraveled in Superior Court's P Division, which is extremely expensive and a waste of judicial resources," Stebner said.
